Employers are very familiar with how to set-up and prepare for participation in career fairs. We would like to offer a few suggestions on how to make the most of your experience with our middle schoolers.

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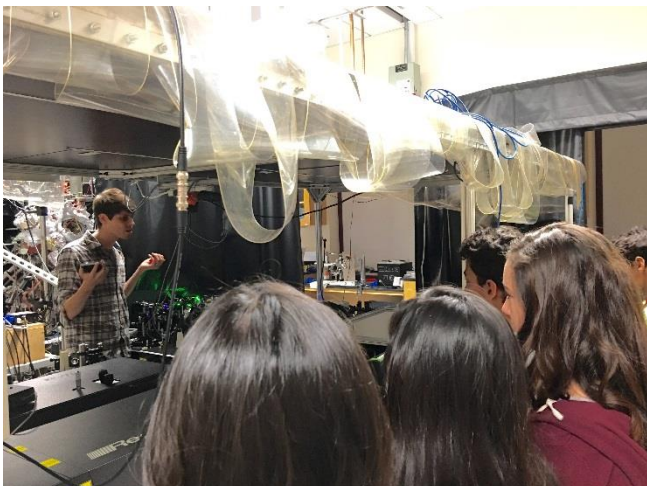
Partners will be provided with a 10 x 10 space, one table and two chairs to work with in the Fair area. Using color, technology and handouts will go a long way in sparking interest with the target population.

Know Your Audience

Middle school youth can be timid and reluctant to engage employers. Be prepared to stop youth and invite them to discuss their interests and how their strengths could be connected to your work. All LBUSD students have taken the Middle School Career Interest Survey which helps them determine what career sector they may be most suited for based on their strengths and hobbies.

The Team Approach

There will be approximately 1800 students visiting employer tables in the fair area over the course of one day! When possible, it would be best to have at least two representatives at the booth so that several students can ask questions and be engaged as much as possible.
