They will be engaged in discovering: How can I apply my new found skills to support an action plan that furthers my goals and benefits the broader community?

CAREER EXPLORATION THROUGH PROJECT-BASED LEARNING

LBS students will explore major California industry sectors through project-based learning, including skill building design challenges, that allows them to work collaboratively, think critically, apply knowledge, and demonstrate persistence and reflection. LBUSD is committed to supporting these endeavors by providing a variety of curricular and multimedia resources including, Career Pillar, a user friendly, webbased career exploration tool.

Example of Project-Based Career Curriculum:

Design Your Own App

This project utilizes the Massachusetts Institute of Technology's App Tutorial program, and a detailed supporting lesson plan for teachers, to guide students through the process of designing an app. Students design an app to meet a community need, then collect and analyze data on the effectiveness of the product. IT Design Teams create app descriptions along with pitch skits. Finally teams perform their skits and receive feedback using a checklist rubric.
